Seems kind of strange, but this is the first time in the past 25 years that we will not have to worry about new lambs in the barn. The horses are still with us in Tucson, where they too have been acclimating to the warm Tucson summers.

Throughout the year the kids seemed to come and go...Kim was home for Thanksgiving. Charles visited Kale for the California deer season, and Kale will be doing an Arizona Coues deer hunt during the Christmas holidays. Carena is flying home from Spain for the holidays, and are looking forward to seeing all the family back together in Tucson this Christmas.
