Charles continues as an Emeritus ST Research Ecologist with the University of Arizona and USGS. He spent a large part of this past summer in the field on Mt Lemmon continuing his research on the Cordilleran Flycatcher (COFL), focusing on documenting the annual cycle of this Neotropical migrant bird. He was only able to recapture two of the six returning birds to remove their geolocators. These geolocator units were put on the birds last summer and remotely tracked their movements during migration and through the winter in southern Mexico. Charles is also working closely with the residents of Mt Lemmon to establish artificial nesting sites for flycatchers and has focused on publishing research updates for the public in the Mt Lemmon Echoes newsletter, along with papers in professional journals. Charles is still very busy with Homestead Firearms, gun appraisals, FFL transfers and assisting Jacque with the Parts department.

Carena and Chris were married in late June in Illinois and several family members along with her cousins Joseph and Ramona were able to attend. Carena and Chris' primary focus right now is on their new a baby girl, scheduled to arrive in late February 2022. 


